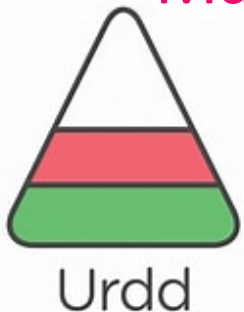

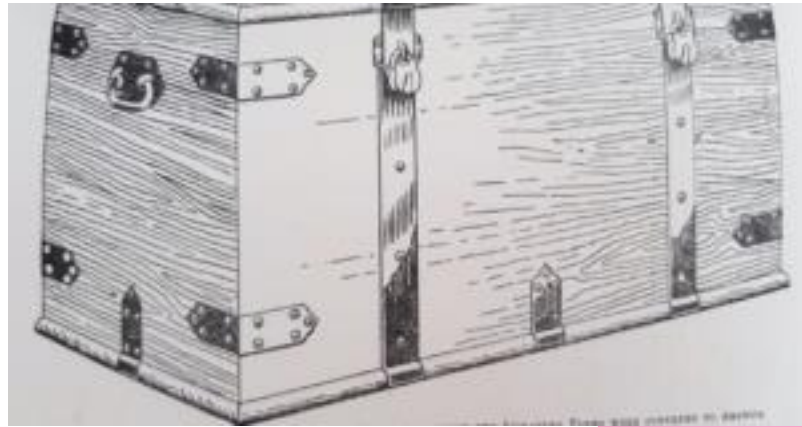

WE Women of Wales, are proud to recall that there is between our little Principality and the great country of the United States of America a close historical tie in the quest for World Peace. It was an American citizen, Elihu Burritt, who inspired our countryman Henry Richard, to organise a series of National Peace Congresses in the middle years of the century. According to the plan of Elihu's first Peace Conference was to have been held in the summer of 1848. So anxious was he about international reconciliation that he proceeded in order to make the preliminary arrangements. He failed in Paris. Then, accompanied by Richard, he went to Brussels, & a memorable Peace Conference was held here in September, 1848, attended by delegates from America & Great Britain. The work of building the Temple of Peace was begun by the united efforts of the American from New York and the Welshman from Tregaron. When, some years later, in 1914, the Temple of Peace was shattered to its foundations, America was our thought, and it is no exaggeration to say that a thrill of joy was felt in many of our homes in the United States of America decided to enter the world and make common sacrifice with us. It is on the comradeship between an American and a son of Wales in the cause of Peace, to the knowledge of our joint sacrifice in the World War, that emboldens us to address to you. We are not actuated by any political motives.

We speak simply as the Women of Wales of a nation whose glory it has been to contribute towards any land or people, and whose coming on earth of the reign of fellows! We long for the day when the affairs of the subject no longer to the verdict of the sword, but that the dawn of the Peace which shall be hastened were it possible for America in the Council of the League of Nations to be done we do not know; but we do know that the two great peoples who did so much to end the War rests largely the burden of lasting peace without which all that we have achieved has already been achieved by America with other nations at Washington in the naval armaments, and at Geneva in the measures to put an end to the detestable trade in opium and drugs. And we hail with delight the news that the foot to secure for America, with her noble participation in the functions of the Permanent International Justice. The future is bright as the women of this generation, do not come an opportunity as real as the respect. We would, therefore, appeal to you, Women of the United States of America, with malice towards none and charity for all, with firmness in the right to see the right, to aid in the effort of the generations which come after us to build a world of a warless world.
