



Dhá thír, pobal amháin agus grúpaí na n-óg ag ceiliúradh i gConamara

Bíonn buaicphointí éagsúla ag daoine a chuireann deireadh an tsamhraidh in iúl, idir thorthaí na hArdteistiméireachta a fháil, dul ar laethanta saoire thar lear sula dtéann na gasúir ar ais ar scoil nó freastal ar fhéile cheoil amháin eile. Ach do ghrúpaí áirithe, tá buaicphointe thar a bheith speisialta ina nasctar ceol, cairdeas, neart damhsa agus mionteangacha.

Chun deireadh a chur leis an samhradh, tagann pobal TG Lurgan, a bhíonn lonnaithe in Indreabhán i nGaeltacht Chonamara, le chéile chun ceolchoirm speisialta a chur ar stáitse.

I mbliana, d'eagraigh TG Lurgan ceolchoirm fhuinniúil i gcomhpháirt le Urdd Gobaith Cymru, eagraíocht óige sa Bhreatain Bheag a bunaíodh sa bhliain 1922, agus bhí an cheolchoirm sin ar siúl Dé hAoine seo caite.

Ní hé seo an chéad uair ag an dá ghrúpa ag obair as lámh a chéile mar is é seo an tochtú togra atá curtha i dtoll a chéile acu. Thosaigh an dá eagraíocht ag teacht le chéile le linn aimsir Covid agus is léir go bhfuil an togra ag dul ó neart go neart ó shin.





Deir Céad-Aire na Breataine Bige, Eluned Morgan, faoin togra: "I measc na rudaí go léir atá i gcoitinne ag an mBreatain Bheag agus Éirinn, tá an ceol fite fuaite inár bhféiniúlachtaí náisiúnta."

Mar sin, luíonn sé le réasún go bhfuair leaganacha d'amhráin os cionn milliún radharc ar líne, idir ardáin físeán agus ceoil, leaganacha d'amhráin ar nós Texas Hold 'Em le Beyoncé níos luaithe i mbliana agus Golau'n Dallu/Dallta ag na Soilse nó Blinding Lights le The Weeknd, mar is fearr aithne air, sa bhliain 2021.

Mar sheoid na bliana seo, cuireadh leagan d'amhrán le Florence The Machine, Dog Days Are Over, ar stáitse. Toradh na hoibre sin? Amhrán draíochtúil le ceangal comhtháite idir an Ghaeilge agus an Bhreatnais.

Le beoshruthú ar fáil ar líne ag TG Lurgan agus ar fáil ar na meáin shóisialta ag BLOC TG4, ardán ar líne atá curtha ar fáil ag TG4 dóibh siúd atá os cionn 18 mbliana d'aois, ní hamháin go raibh daoine ar fud fad na cruinne in ann a bheith ag breathnú ar an ócáid ar líne, ach bhí os cionn 400 scoláire ó Choláiste Lurgan, 30 scoláire ón Urdd agus 500 duine áitiúil i láthair ag an ócáid Dé hAoine.

Bhí meascán den dá theanga le cloisteáil ar feadh na hoíche, bhí comhláithriú ar an bpríomhstáitse agus ar chúl stáitse mar a raibh na láithreoirí ag déanamh iarrachtaí cúpla nath a fhoghlaim óna chéile.

De bhrí go raibh an seó ar siúl ar feadh ceithre uair an chloig, bhí deis ag neart grúpaí ó chúrsaí Gaeltachta na bliana seo a bheith ar stáitse le leaganacha Gaeilge d'amhráin ar nós Diamonds le Rihanna, Rasputin le Boney M agus Starships le Nicki Minaj.

Excitement builds for Conamara gig in Irish and Welsh

Excitement is mounting in Conamara as Ireland and Wales join forces again to record a bilingual cover of a hit song by Florence and the Machine.

Hundreds of Irish and Welsh students will take to the stage tonight in the Gaeltacht village of Indreabhán to perform 'Dog Days Are Over' in both their native languages.

The gala concert is the latest collaboration between Coláiste Lurgan and the Welsh youth organisation Urdd Gobaith Cymru.

Organisers say the initiative is part of a "shared vision" to showcase minority languages as living and breathing entities, ensuring that young people have the confidence to use Welsh and Irish in everyday life.





The students have been rehearsing all week and gave RTÉ News a sneak preview of what to expect.





Speaking about the musical collaboration, Mícheál Ó Foighil, Director of TG Lurgan, said the project is of "significant importance" to them and they are delighted to continue to strengthen the partnership.

"This project is a symbol of the deep cultural ties between our two countries. It shows how we can learn from each other and emphasises the strength and increasing relevance of our languages, breaking down language barriers in an ever changing physical and online world.


